Wallington United Reformed Church Dear Friends,

A few months back, following on from our 50th Anniversary service, I took a look at the first affirmation in the Statement Concerning the Nature, Faith and Order of the United Reformed Church. I indicated that from time to time I would take the opportunity to explore the other affirmations, so this month I want to take a look at the second affirmation.

The life of faith to which we are called is the Spirit's gift, continually received through the Word, the Sacraments and our Christian life together.

When considering the first affirmation we noted that this Trinitarian God of ours is God of all of life, not just a religious escapism. Now we recognise that the call of God is always around us - the life of faith is continually received wherever we are and whenever we take the time to consider his presence and offer our praise. It underlines what we have said about God and reminds us that we are here at God's invitation - faith is his gift.

God's presence anywhere is not something to be taken for granted, or regarded as commonplace, but a gift of grace. A wonder to be contemplated, marvelled over and enjoyed. Something that should affect our living whether we are in the church building, in an office or factory, in a football ground or school playground, on a bus or moorland hill.

There is always something to remind us of our God - our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer - if we live believing that his presence is in all of life.

Remember that the United Reformed Church is just that - a church; a group of Christians, not individuals seeking faith on their own. We would affirm that it is in company with others

that we grow in faith and receive more of God's blessing. We are continually blessed, and continually renewed in our faith. And the ways that we receive this blessing -through Word, Sacrament, and our life together echo the Trinity we affirmed at the very beginning:

The Word - the Bible, the record of God's activity in creation and with his people throughout history.

The Sacraments - those reminders of Christ's activity and means of grace. With the rest of the Reformed tradition we believe in two sacraments - Baptism and Holy Communion.

And our life together - where two or three are gathered Christ is also, through his Holy Spirit. We learn and grow together by our sharing under the guidance of that Spirit; - sharing our insights, and testing them alongside the insights of others.

It takes us back to the beginning. Our faith begins with an affirmation of the Trinity, an affirmation that is made in common with Christians around the globe, and throughout history.

Our faith is a communal faith: we learn and share together and grow together.

Our concern is for all God's people - those whom he created, whom he came and lived amongst, and whom he still empowers.

However it is a communal faith that we are each called to stand and declare on our own - for each of us needs to discover God, as Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

Our Creator - our Redeemer - our Sustainer.

May you be open to the presence of God in all of life this month.



Our Wider Community

A series of devastating earthquakes have hit southern Turkey and north-west Syria. The first deadly earthquake struck while people were inside their homes, asleep in their beds, with no warning signs. More than 54,000 buildings, including hospitals and schools, were destroyed or damaged. This devastating magnitude 7.8 earthquake struck the Turkish province of Kahramanmaras, approximately 23 kilometers east of Nurdagi in the Gaziantep province near the Syrian border, at 4:17 a.m. local time on Monday, February 6, 2023, followed by a 7.5 magnitude aftershock nine hours later. At least 13 million people in the region have been impacted by the earthquake and aftershock. Turkey's president declared a threemonth state of emergency in the 10 provinces hardest hit by the earthquake.

A second earthquake struck the border region of Turkey and Syria, just two weeks after the area was devastated by a larger quake that killed more than 47,000 people and damaged or destroyed hundreds of thousands of homes. The earthquake, this time with a magnitude of 6.4, was centred near the southern Turkish city of Antakya and was felt in Syria, Egypt and Lebanon.

World Day of Prayer March 3rd 2023

A women led, global, ecumenical movement Informed Prayer; Prayerful Action: We encourage women to plan ecumenically for the

World Day of Prayer, promoting prayerful living and worship for men, women and young people and helping raise awareness of the lives and concerns of others throughout the

world, especially those who write

the service.

The artist, Hui-Wen HSAIO, has used several motifs that highlight Taiwan's best-known features to express how the Christian faith brings peace and a new vision to Taiwan.

The women in the painting are sitting by a stream, praying silently and looking up into the dark. Despite the uncertainty of the path ahead, they know that the salvation of Christ has come.

Two endangered species are featured: the Mikado pheasant and the Black-faced Spoonbill, which are both of unique



significance to the Taiwanese people. The Mikado pheasant is endemic to mountainous regions of Taiwan and is usually regarded as one of Taiwan's national birds. The Black-faced Spoonbill migrates thousands of miles every year to spend the winter in Taiwan. Their distinctiveness symbolizes a characteristic of the Taiwanese people—confidence and perseverance in times of difficulty.

The green grass and Phalaenopsis (Butterfly) orchids stand out against the dark background. They are the pride of Taiwan, which has a worldwide reputation as the "Kingdom of Orchids." In recent decades, Taiwanese orchid's exports have increased, and Butterfly orchids have frequently been featured in international competitions. This beautiful island is known by its rich natural resources. Green grass represents the Taiwanese as simple, confident, strong and under God's care.
