Dear Friends....

As in many years the month of February sees us entering Lent and this year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Not only does this mean that some people will need to balance the start of Lent with a desire to treat their loved one to a special occasion, but also that Lent will be with us very soon. We are therefore about to start a journey we make every year, which will end in Jerusalem in a time of great darkness and despair, but which stuns the world with the real ending, which is actually a great new beginning. The days of Lent are not just a countdown to Holy Week and Easter but recognise the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness grappling with temptation and the purpose in his life.

As in past years we will be following a Lent course and this year we are going to be using *Christ and the Chocolaterie* by Hilary Brand which is inspired by the film *Chocolat*, which was in turn based on the bestselling novel by Joanne Harris. Although Hilary Brand's book was first published 20 years ago it has been revised and updated for 2024. Each session uses extracts from the film, Bible passages, discussion and more, to explore issues about God, the world and what it means to be human. The five session themes are: Giving up – the prelude to change; Giving out – the power of a gift;

Getting wise - the possibility of change;

Getting real - the power of acceptance;

Growing up – the process of change.

It may seem strange to be focussing on chocolate when many people will be seeking to give up the confectionary but, for those who haven't seen the film or read the book, chocolate in Lent is one of the things that comes up.

The group will meet via Zoom at 8pm on Tuesday evenings – the 20<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> February and the 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> March. If those dates don't work for you or you prefer an inperson meeting I will be running a group at St Andrew's on Friday afternoons at 2pm and you would be welcome there.

In the past these groups have proved to be enjoyable and they have been beneficial for individuals and for us as a church.

Whether you are giving up chocolate or not this Lent I hope the journey through these dark days of Winter as we move into Spring will be a time of discovery and growth.

### Laying it down



**2024** (MMXXIV) is the current year, and is a leap year starting on Monday of the Gregorian calendar, the 2024th year of the Common Era (CE) and *Anno Domini* (AD) designations, the 24th year of the 3rd millennium and



the 21st century, and the 5th year of the 2020s decade.

How many of us, way back when, thought that the year 2000 was w-a-y in the future, and now...here we are... almost a quarter of the

way through the 21st Century!

21st Century...flying cars, hypersonic travel, hyper-loop trains, helpful robotics, easy space travel and other imagined ways of travelling...but did we really think the Channel Tunnel would exist? Or that Concorde would NOT be around?

Space travel has given us a wealth of knowledge which has in turn helped us create inventions and technologies that have made human life easier and helped us learn more.

Camera Phones: In the 1990s a team from the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) worked to create cameras small enough to fit on spacecraft and with



scientific quality. A third of all cameras contain this technology.

Scratch Resistant Lens: The Lewis Research Centre attempted to develop diamond-hard coatings for aerospace systems later creating a technique that was developed and patented for just that purpose.

CAT Scans: A space program needs a pretty good digital image, the JPL played a lead role in developing this

technology which in turn helped create CAT scanners and radiography.

LEDs: Red LEDs are being used in space to grow plants and heal humans on Earth. LED technology



used by NASA has contributed to the development of medical devices such as WARP 10. [The WARP [Warfighter Accelerated Recovery by Photobiomodulation] 10 is a highintensity, portable LED unit intended for treatment of chronic pain by emitting energy in the near-infrared (IR) spectrum.]

NIKE Air-Trainers wouldn't exist if it weren't for suit construction technology developed by NASA. It was a former NASA engineer that first pitched the idea.



Foil Blankets: These metallic sheets which are now used on Earth in extreme temperatures, evolved from a lightweight insulator NASA developed to protect spacecraft and people in space.

Ear Thermometers: NASA and Diatek developed an eight ounce aural thermometer which uses infrared astronomy technology to measure the amount of energy emitted by the ear drum.
